The CEF Endowment provided \$172,018 last year.

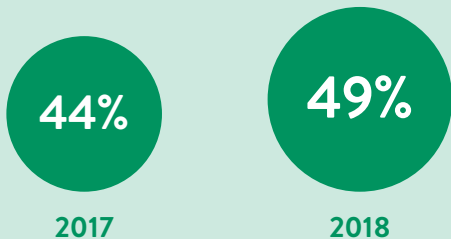
